What's a workplace?

- A place in which people are working
- Where do people work now during Covid-19?

Working from Home is NOT new

- Before 1760 (the Industrial Revolution), everyone works from home
- Limited Occupation: carpenter, farmer, shopkeeper, tailor, etc
- Your co-workers live at the same place or nearby



The Industrial Revolution

- Transition from making products manually by hands to using machines to make products
- Use technologies to support mass production
- This requires a space to store machines AND have humans operate those machines

Popularity of Iron and Steel

- The Industrial Revolution made iron and steel very cheap!
- People used them to construct tall buildings
- Skyscraper (>=10 floors) first existed in this era

With Skyscraper, offices become very popular

- Challenge: how to *efficiently* design an office space?
- First office design, called the Taylorist Office
 - Workers sit together in an open room
 - Managers or owners sit in a private office to observe workers
- Designed mainly for efficiency but not for workers' happiness
 - Workers are cramped in a small area
 - Noise problem: a space full of telephones and typewriters
 - No social interaction between workers

Office Design

• After that, office designs focused more on workers' quality of life



Open-plan office: divide office into teams, encourage communication



Action office: increase more functionalities (e.g., storage space, ergonomic chairs)

Cubicle Farm in 1980

- During this time, computers became publicly available
- New office design: cubicle farm
- Pros: Use computers to replace manual work, increase productivity
- Cons: Workers were unhappy, looking at computers all the time



Modern Office: Atari in 1980's

- Workers' happiness and output are the main priorities
- Bigger workspace
- Flexible office rules:
 - Can come and leave anytime
 - Can play games or have social events at work
 - Can wear anything to work
- As long as you get your work done, you are good!

Work From Home (Remote Working)

• This work-from-home situation is different from the one in the past (before the industrial revolution)

Challenges:

- Co-workers live far away communication problem
- The need for remote computers/technology a physical computer at office no longer works

Technologies to support work from home

- High speed home internet
- Teleconference software (e.g., Zoom, Skype)
- Instant communication software (e.g., WeChat, Messenger)
- Project management platforms (e.g., Asana, MicrosoftTeam)
- Network security platforms (e.g., VPN)

Which software/platform uses cloud computing? Which software/platform generates big data?

Some jobs can't be done remotely...now

- Hair salon / massage / beauty services
- Fire fighter
- Food delivery
- Surgeon
- Policemen
- Truck/taxi driver
- They require physical contacts

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Will remote working become the new normal?

- No one knows for sure
- My opinion: maybe not
- Some tasks require physical interaction in order to be efficient/productive
- What about working remotely for 2-3 days a week and working in office for the rest of the weekdays?
- I have been doing this and it works surprisingly well for me

What if workers can work remotely 2-3 days a week?

- Office design will be different
- Only come to office for tasks that require physical interaction
- Don't need to have a large space anymore
- Same desk/computer can be shared by many people (who don't work on the same day)

Remote Working: Workers' Happiness?

- "When working from home, we often lose the human interaction, structure, and collaboration that we typically get in an office setting,"
- "It can be a challenge to concentrate, which may impact your productivity and work quality,"
- "Over time, these factors can impact mental health and possibly contribute to burnout."
